After a long dreary winter is seems like Spring may finally arrive. The first day of Spring was this Thursday and old man winter's grip seems to be slipping, as the forecast is for highs in the 50s. The recent rains seem to have washed the salt from the roads. If the forecast holds, I may take the cover off one of the Zs and get the car out for the first drive of the year, on Saturday or Sunday. Nissan has hit a milestone selling 400,000 Nissan Leafs (or is it Leaves?) and has come out with the bigger battery longer range Leaf e+. Nissan sold 654 Leafs in February and 211 370Zs. More than 3 time as many Leafs than Zs. While it was February, what does this portend for the next Z, as more and more mainstream auto makers amp up their production of electric and electric hybrid vehicles?

Top Gear (see TG.com) asked Nissan's Chief Planning Officer, Philippe Klein, if performance cars are in the frame for Nissan's future. "There are a lot of answers to this question. First of all, it's true that performance cars are 'under the gun' of regulations. It's making the idea more complicated. But the emotion [for us] is still there, for us and for our customers. We have the Z and the GT-R, lots of fans, and we are fans of these cars also. I'm not able to give you details, but I would like you to keep in mind that we are considering the future of these vehicles."

Why should we keep the faith? It's been an awfully long time, Philippe "Yes, you should keep the faith, because we do! The driving experience is very high on our priority list. I don't know how much

experience you have with EVs, but they are very fun to drive. If you drive a Leaf e+, it is quite fast, with good acceleration, with a low centre of gravity, and it's easy to drive and fun to drive. "This is why we're moving to electrification with [hybrid] e-power. In the end we would like the regulations to take nothing away from how fun the car is to drive. It's not always easy, but this is the direction. Yes, we're still looking at the future of sports cars, hot cars and fun to drive cars."

Interesting, isn't it, that as soon as we probe the future of quick Nissans, the man in charge of the company's future cars starts talking up electricity? So, will the next Zed or GT-R go EV? "We're still working hard on different options" says Klein, "but I can't give you an answer just yet. The regulations bring a lot of concerns, so the question is how to answer these constraints and still offer a car to the consumer that's fun to drive. But there are different options and we're working on them. We're defending the sports car."

Time for one last query. While the 370Z goes wrinkly and old, Toyota's new Supra is *the* cult car of 2019. Would Nissan need to form an alliance, like Toyota and BMW did, to build a new 370Z? After all, the brand is already in bed with Renault and Mitsubishi. Klein is very coy with his answer. "I cannot answer this - what I can say is whatever we do, we have to carry our brand very strongly, otherwise it makes no sense."

In other Nissan news: Nissan turns to the 2019 Rock the Ocean's Tortuga Music Festival, part of Live Nation's premier family of country music festivals, to reveal its latest production vehicle. Nissan promises a special vehicle debut during a live performance before thousands of festival attendees on Friday, April 12, the first evening of the three-day festival. "Nissan is constantly looking for new ways to directly connect with customers. The Tortuga Music Festival gives us a stunning reveal spot for a new 2020 Nissan vehicle with thousands of music fans to help share the moment," said Claudia Marquez, vice president, sales and vehicle operations, Nissan North America. "This important new production model is going to turn heads, both on the beach and on social media." Could this be the new Z? I highly doubt it as the previous response to Top Gear indicates it is still a work in progress. Motor Trend has captured spy photos of what they describe as a camouflaged 2020 Nissan Juke. This seems

the likely candidate.


