Every once in a while, I like to look at the Nissan website to see how the Z is selling. In the last quarter they sold 343 Z's compared to last year where they sold 86. And this current year to date they have sold 1309, which in my opinion is not a whole lot. I know it is an image car for Nissan but gone are the glory days when the Z used to sell like hotcakes. The Corvette sells about 2,800 per month in comparison. The Supra sold 4952 units last year. I suspect all the other competition out there is making it more difficult plus in this current world, sports cars are just not practical, but were they ever? The 2024 Nissan Z Nismo is starting at \$66,085 base price does not help matters. It is only available with a nine-speed automatic. Interesting... I remember when the new Supra came out it got a lot of negative press because it was only available with an automatic. Like I said above, there is a lot of competition in this price range, including the Mustang Darkhorse, Toyota Supra, and BMW M2. The base Z starts at \$43,305 which is \$1220 higher than 2023. The current best selling car for Nissan is their Sentra which delivered 31,612 this past quarter. This is up 41% this year. As you know, I happen to own a 2021 version and am pleased with it so far. The Nissan Versa sales have increased 91% from last year. Probably the rising fuel costs contributed to those cars increasing in sales volume. As far as SUVs are

> concerned, the Nissan Rogue certainly is their bread-and-butter vehicle. This past quarter they sold 63,346 units which is up 62% from last year. And the electric Ariya has sold 4504 units. Not bad I guess


