Wheel Repair Tech Session

At least most of it had melted by late afternoon. The warmth of the sun and the longer days certainly helps out. Not only the snow, the rain the day before was rather unusual. I had our new 2024 Nissan Sentra at work. It was perfectly clean when I got to work that morning. When I left that afternoon, it was as if somebody dumped dirt all over the car. Apparently we received this "dirty" rain, which just absolutely made the car look filthy. I don't ever recall having this type of rain before. It truly was covered with dirt! In talking to some of the workers there, the Chicagoland dealers were the ones who wanted to bring their cars in for display to the public. Thank you to them. However, my overall impression is that it's just not as lucrative. I have been known to go back a second time through the years but once was good enough for me this year. Again, many electric vehicles were on display. Most of the rides they were offering were of the electric variety as well. I did take advantage of a couple of them. Instant torque was certainly fun to experience with these cars. I know they keep trying to improve on them, but we shall see what the future holds. The other thing I noticed was that the restaurants in the facility are no longer around. No McDonalds, Connies Pizza or even Starbucks? What is going on??

As far as Nissan, they did have a Z present in "Bayside Blue", beautiful as always. Of course, we gathered around it as a club and took pictures. Many other Nissan vehicles were also displayed, including the new Armada, Kicks and Murano. In talking with the Nissan product specialist, they were no more aware of Nissan's future than what we know and read online. They did make a comment that not having a hybrid can dissuade potential buyers from buying their products. I think they are still negotiating with Honda, from what I read. We shall see what will eventually occur.

We also had a chance to visit **Wellis Alloy Wheel Repair** a few weeks ago. Many thanks to Warren Ellis, the owner of this business for talking to us about wheel repair as well as refinishing/painting. He truly was passionate about what he does and it shows. He demonstrated some of the equipment they have ifor repairing wheels of all shapes and sizes. We were all very impressed. If you recall, I have been there several times through the years to have my rims fixed and they do a great job. Same-day service on several occasions. He had asked me to bring him a bent rim for demonstration purposes. Of course, I already had one from my '83 280ZX turbo. This particular rim was bent probably 30+ years ago as I tried to avoid an accident and hit a curb. The tire did not blow. However, the rim was quite bent, and I have not used it since that time. It had been sitting in my attic collecting cobwebs until I brought it to his facility. He was able to fix the outer lip of the rim which obviously was bent, but he stated that the center portion of the rim was actually bent as well and would make it very difficult to repair adequately without possibly cracking the rim itself. I asked him not to worry about it as I was not using it anyways. Back to my attic it goes.

With regard to the ZCCA, I attended a Zoom meeting with other Z club officers from around the country a few weeks ago. There's a lot of exciting Z events happening across the United States this coming year. These include the Texas Z Fest, East Coast Z Nationals, ZdayZ, Branson Z Fest, but unfortunately no Midwest Z Heritage event. MZH involves rotating amongst five different Midwest Z clubs to host a three day event. If you recall, we last hosted it in 2022. A Z club in Detroit was supposed to host it last year, but it fell through. I'm not quite sure if that club even exists anymore to be honest. It appears now only two of the five clubs are interested in continuing this event, so at this point, it is not happening. Our rotation would not be until 2027 if I recall properly. We can discuss if we will continue to host or not. It is unfortunate, as it has been going on since 2003. I was at that one in Indianapolis. Time will tell.

A very exciting event will resurface this summer called the Z Rally Across America. This was only done once back in 1995, prior to the car convention in Atlanta, Georgia. It involved driving several Z cars from different clubs and organizations in a Z pattern across the United States and ending up at the ZCON convention. I do not have all the details as far as the exact dates for this year, but the journey will start three weeks prior to ZCON 2025 in Nashville, which is in September. We will be in the first leg of the "Z" so that puts us at the end of August roughly. It will come through the Chicago area from Iowa on the way to Cleveland. Our responsibility would be to get Z cars to leave from a site here in the Chicagoland area to Cleveland. Our Z club did participate in





this back in 1995 and it was really a cool event. I also was fortunate enough to see the final leg of this event as it ended up at the ZCON host hotel in Atlanta for the convention. Just a beautiful array of Z cars in a parade-like setting with Mr K coming out of the last Z. What a sight!! I will keep you posted as we get more information.

Last but not least, the granddaddy of them all. ZCON 2025. Location: Nashville, Tennessee. Dates: September 8-13, 2025. Expectation: Awesome!! This is the one you want to go to. Only an 8 hour drive from Chicago. It appears Nissan likes to host the convention every five years at their headquarters here in the States. Even with their financial troubles, they are still a strong supporter of this event. I have talked to several people who already are planning on attending, including yours truly. If you remember, I got a small taste of it this past September in Tampa. I flew out just for the car show and came back. So much more to do than just a car show. Will I be showing my Z? Most likely. Which one? Probably the 1990 300TT. This car has been to many conventions through the years. Including the 1995 event in Atlanta that I talked about earlier as well as the convention up in Kingston, Ontario in 2021 to name a few. This latter event, my wife was pregnant with our first one. If you haven't already registered, please do so and definitely reserve a room at the host hotel. I suspect we will caravan down there as a group, but more information will be passed along as it gets closer.

In closing, we have a great club with a lot of history. It is spring and we will be having many different types of events this year so get your Z ready and "Enjoy the Ride"!!
